

WATER SERVICE LINE INVENTORY

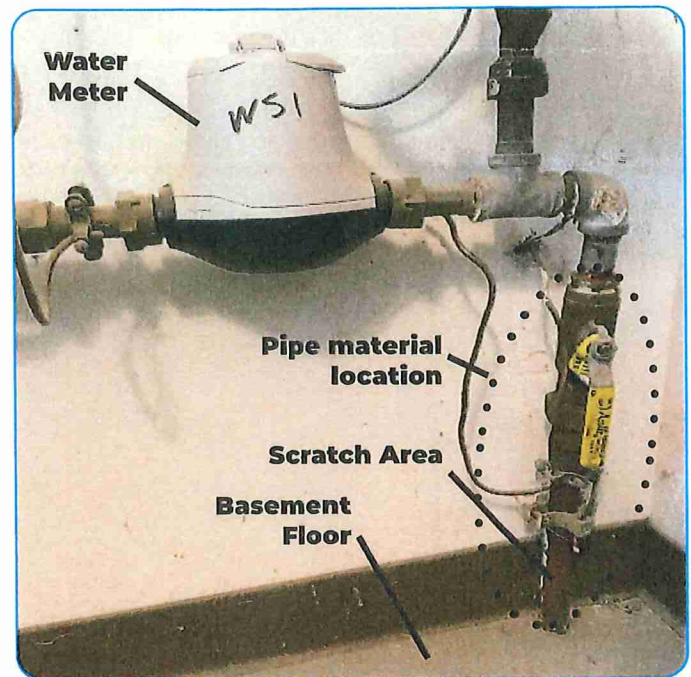


The City of Waterville is working to complete an inventory of all water service lines within the system. The goal of the inventory is to identify the material type of every service line.

The inventory is required by the US Environmental Protection Agency and scheduled to be complete in September 2024. We are asking residents to help with the process and perform a material survey.

A Bolton and Menk representative and City Staff will be going to homes to collect this information starting in the middle of September. You can still provide this information ahead of time by following the link or QR code below and filling out the survey. (Please note, a photo is needed).

If you provide this information, we will not stop by your home unless we have a question related to the picture.



What is a service line? A service line is the pipe connecting the water main to the interior plumbing in a building.

You can identify your pipe material by checking your household service connections inside your home, typically located in the basement.

You can complete the survey by following the link below and submitting a survey with an image of your service line.

LEAD

A dull, silver-gray color that is easily scratched with a coin. Use a magnet to detect the material – strong magnets will not cling to lead pipes.



GALVANIZED

A dull, silver-gray color. Use a magnet to detect the material – strong magnets will typically cling to galvanized pipes.



PLASTIC

Blue or black pipe.



COPPER

The color of a penny.
